He devotes much of his time to the movements and activities of civil society in general and youth in particular. He is a founding member of *Conseil National de la Jeunesse* of Mali (2000), *CJA (Coalition Jeunesse Action)* (2008), as well as a number of other organizations working in the field of citizen action and promotes volunteerism. He is the founding president of *CONJEDEV (Convention des Jeunes pour le Développement)* (1996) which works with more than 300 volunteers throughout Mali. Since 2006, Bayni is also the president of ICVolunteers’ national office in Mali, ICV-Mali. On the recommendation of the National Youth Council and the Ministry of Youth and Sports, Bayni was nominated for the high office of elected members of the Economic, Social and Cultural Council (one of eight constitutional institutions of the Republic of Mali), where he represents youth. He currently works for the Ministry of Labor, for Civil Service and State Reform, as a lawyer. Bayni is also the Technical Adviser to the Economic, Social and Cultural Council of Mali (since April 2009). He devoted much of his career to consultation and volunteering both for private companies and community development organizations.
